

Make a Citation for an Encyclopedia Article, Print Version

Author's last name, Author's first name. "Title of the Article." Title of the Encyclopedia. Year of the edition.

Example:

Minch, Edwin W. "Spiders." The World Book Encyclopedia. 1997 ed.

- Tips**
1. Follow punctuation exactly as given in the example.
 2. Usually the edition year is found on the encyclopedia spine or cover.
 3. Sometimes the author of an encyclopedia article is found at the end of the article text. If there is none given, then leave the information blank.
 4. For this particular format (the MLA Elementary Level), you don't need the volume number or letter or the pages. In other formats, however, you may be required to provide this information. For your own convenience, you may want to record volume and page numbers when you take notes from an encyclopedia.
